



Ever since its opening in 1958, it has been adored as the landmark of Tokyo. The Special Observatory is located at a height of 250 meters.





Good spots to visit are the Kokyo Gaien National Garden at the Imperial Palace Plaza, which commands a view of the Double Bridge (Main Gate Stone Bridge), and the East Gardens of the Imperial Palace, where relics such as the keep of the Edo Castle still remain.



There are many restaurants in the commercial buildings on the Marunouchi side such as the Marunouchi Bldg. and the Shin-Marunouchi Bldg. Locations on the Yaesu side such as the Yaesu Underground Shopping Center and Granroof are dotted with shops.



#### Shibuya-Omotesando-Harajuku

An area where you can find the latest trends in fashion, cafes, and sweets. It is a pleasant place to walk around while enjoying shopping and eating.




The west side of Shinjuku Station is lined with skyscrapers with restaurants on the upper floors that let you enjoy the night

view while dining. The east side of Shinjuku Station is a large entertainment district where famous spots such as Kabukicho and the Golden Gai are located.









After buying a new card with an advanced payment, you can pass the ticket barrier by touching the automatic ticket gate or bus ticket reading machine with the IC card, and the fare will be deducted automatically. In addition, fares are usually lower than when purchasing tickets at ticket machines in Tokyo (fares are the same in some cases). The card can also be used as electronic money for shopping at registered shops.

#### Sightseeing Bus (tokyo shitamachi bus)

The sightseeing route bus is a convenient route bus that runs from Ueno and Kinshicho to famous sightseeing spots such as Asakusa and Tokyo Skytree.

#### SKY BUSTOKYO / SKY HOP BUS

"SKY BUS TOKYO" is a service that efficiently takes you through major sightseeing spots in Tokyo on an open-top bus. 



Shinjuku station is surrounded by huge electronics stores such as Yamada Denki, Bic Camera, and Yodobashi Camera, which offer plenty of equipment such as PCs and electrical home appliances. With Odakyu Department Store and Keio Department Store at the West Exit along with other stores including Shinjuku Isetan at the East Exit and Shinjuku Takashimaya at the South Exit, the area surrounding the station is lined with huge department stores. Among some of the most popular spots are department store basement food floors, which offer food items, Japanese and Western sweets, prepared dishes, boxed lunches, and more. Many popular shops where eager customers are lined up appear one after another.

This was first post station on the Tokaido road, a major thoroughfare that connected Edo and Kamigata (modern day Tokyo, and Osaka and Kyoto respectively). Its significance to travelers back then is still visible, indicated by the large number of shrines and temples in the area. Shinagawa shrine sits on a small hill and boasts a miniature Mt. Fuji, called Fujizuka. Visitors are welcome to climb this 15-meter high stone structure with steps to take in a wonderful view. Ebara shrine is located next to the Meguro River and is the only shrine in Tokyo that carries its mikoshi (portable shrine) into water. This area also features numerous kakigori (shaved ice) shops and cafes, making it a wonderful place for a relaxing stroll.

# **General Information for Tourists**



#### Climate

There are four distinct seasons. Spring -March to May- and autumn -September to November- are comfortable. However, there are many rainy days (rainy season) from mid-June to July.

In summer, it is hot during the day and humid at night. In winter, there are many clear days but it is often cold and dry.



#### Currency exchange, changing money

As of August 25, 2017, US\$1=¥109.67

Money can be exchanged at currency exchange counters located mainly at banks, post offices, hotels and airports.

#### **Postal services**

Mail can be sent from Japan to abroad at the post office. Postcards and letters can be left at the front desk of your hotel or dropped in a post box on the street or at a tourist site. All postcards cost ¥70. Letters vary from ¥90 to ¥130, depending on the destination.



#### **Smoking**

Although smoking is prohibited in most public facilities as a general rule, there are some facilities with smoking areas. Smoking is prohibited when specified in the streets of downtown areas, shops, restaurants, etc.



#### Currency

The yen ( $\pm$ ) is the currency of Japan. Bills come in denominations of  $\pm$ 10,000,  $\pm$ 5,000,  $\pm$ 2,000, and  $\pm$ 1,000. (Nowadays  $\pm$ 2,000 bills are rare.)

Coins come in denominations of ¥500, ¥100, ¥50, ¥10. ¥5 and ¥1.




#### ATMs that accept overseas credit cards

#### Voltage, power

The voltage in Japan is 100V. The frequency is 50/60Hz. A voltage transformer should be used with electronic items brought over from overseas. The double socket outlet is standard.



#### Tap water

Since Tokyo has the excellent water supply system, it is safe to drink straight tap water.



#### **Consumption tax**

Consumption tax at shops, restaurants, etc. is 8%. Please note whether the tax is included in the indicated price depends on the shop and product.

#### Tax-free system

The requirement for tax exemption is the purchase of general goods (electric appliances, clothing, accessories, etc.) worth over 5,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. For consumable goods (food, drinks, medicine, cosmetics, etc.), tax exemption applies for purchases above 5,000 yen but below 500,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. First, calm down and dial 110. Tell them precisely when and where the accident happened along with your name, phone number, and car license plate number.






